SCHOOL PROFILE

Seton Hall Preparatory School is a private boys high school (grades 9-12) of the Archdiocese of Newark, located in the suburban community of West Orange, Essex County, New Jersey. Seton Hall Preparatory School is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

STUDENT BODY

More than 950 young men from over 135 different towns surrounding the area make up the Prep's student body. Enrollment is selective and based on performance on the *Seton Hall Prep Entrance/Placement/Scholarship Examination*, elementary school records, and recommendations.

CURRICULUM

All students must take four years each of English, Mathematics and Theology; three years of History; two years of a Foreign Language and Lab Science; and one year of Fine or Performing Arts. In addition to this core, students must carry a full schedule of electives which they may choose in line with their interests and abilities.

The school year is divided into three trimesters—

Fall August 31 through December 1

Winter December 5 through March 8

Spring March 12 through June 8

CLASS RANK

Rank is cumulative and includes all subjects— 6.0 credits full year, 2.0 credits trimester courses. Advanced and Honors courses are weighted. Students transferring from other schools are ranked only on those years in attendance at Seton Hall Prep.
